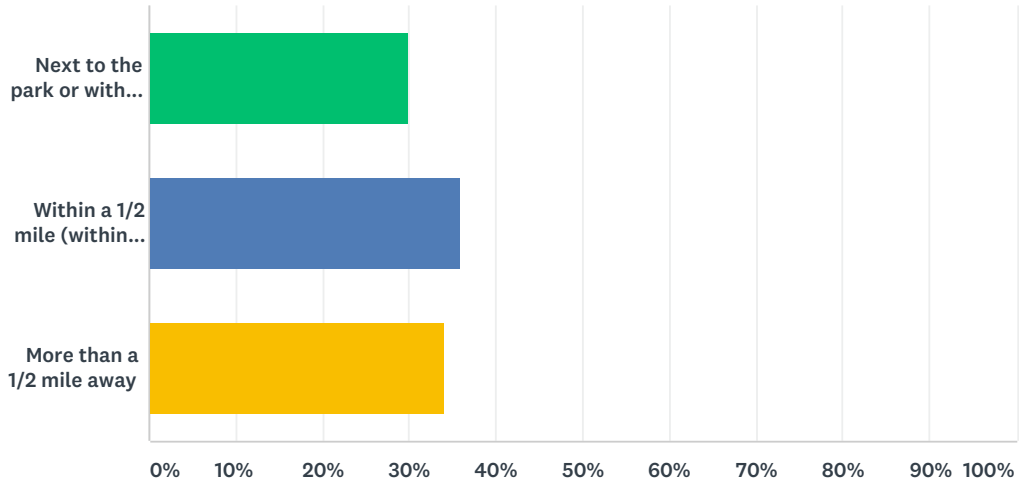


Q1 How near to Lincoln School Park do you live?

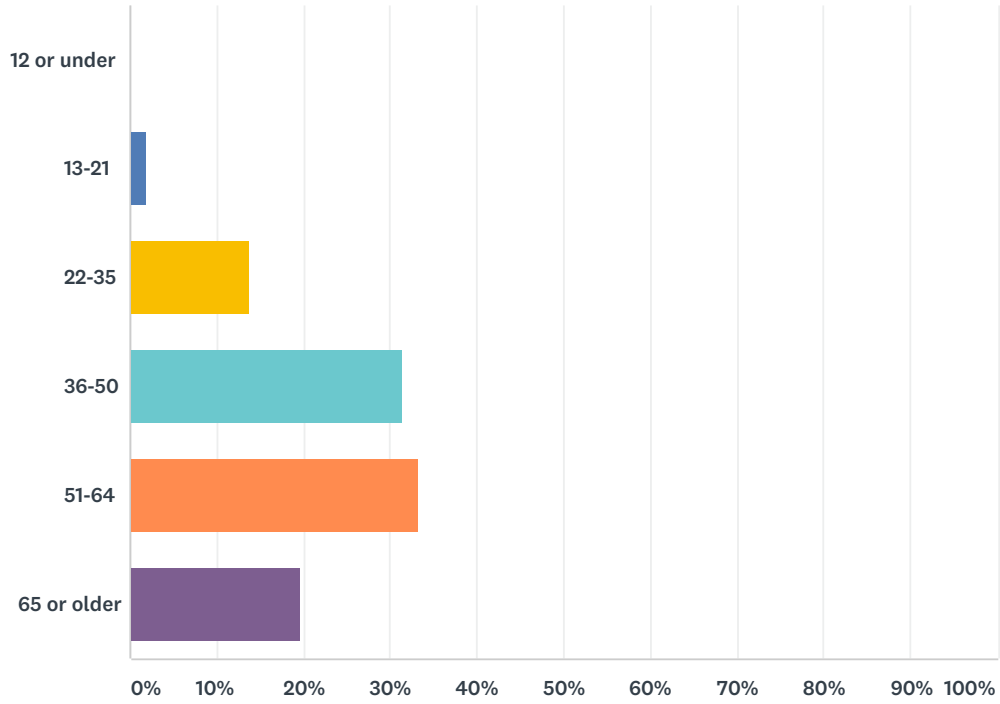

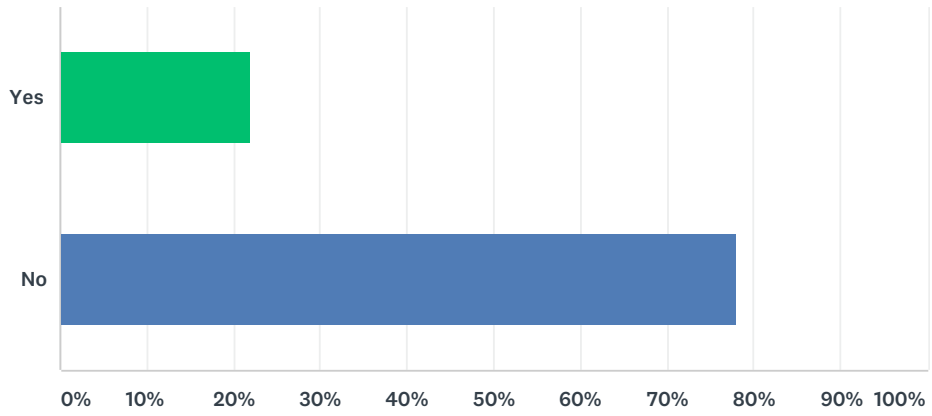

Q3 Did you attend the initial public workshop for the Lincoln School Park renovation project on Tuesday, November 7th?

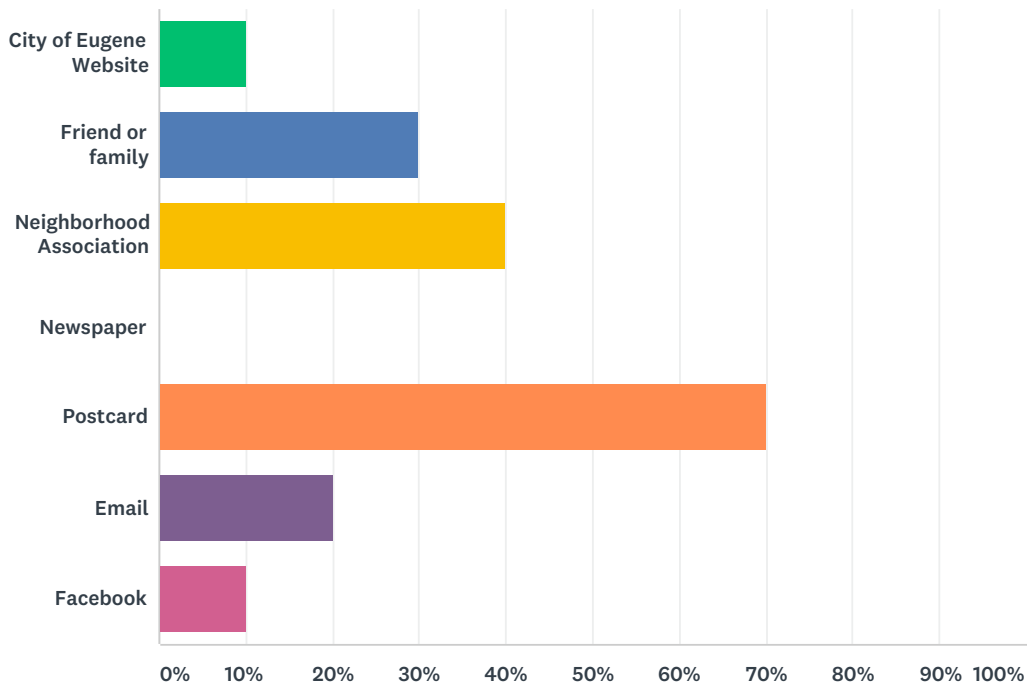

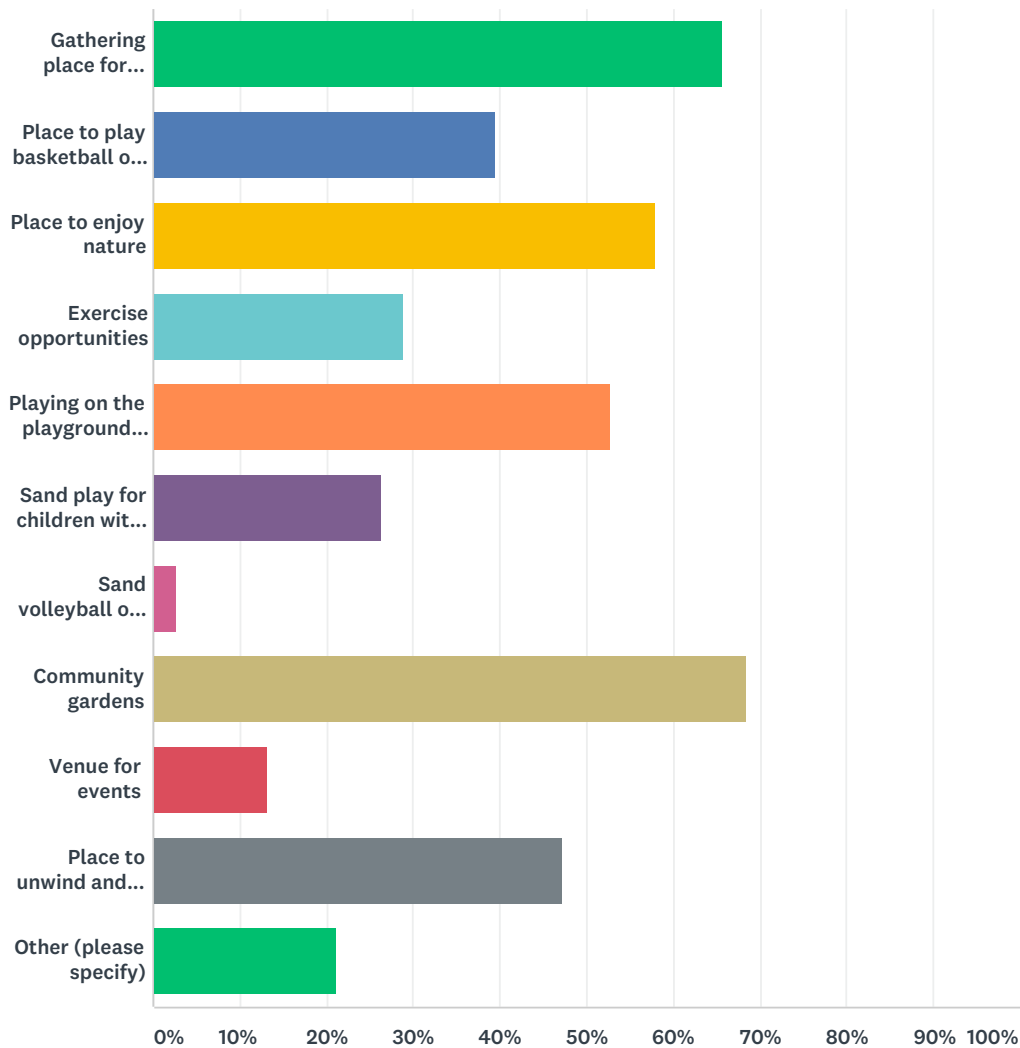

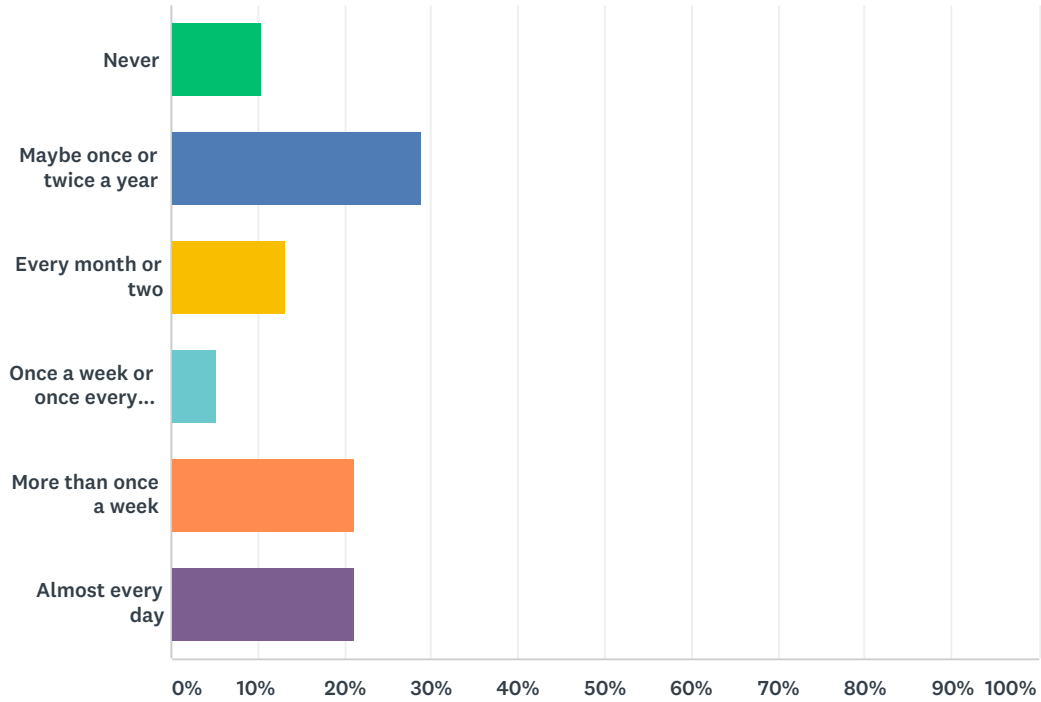
